

TUTORING

It is expected that every effort will be made by the principal and teacher to resolve the learning problems of a student at school before recommending that parents/guardians engage a tutor or seek other outside professional help. The Governing Board believes that by maintaining a high quality instructional staff and providing for a rich, varied curriculum the need for individual tutoring is minimized.

In order to protect both the school district and teachers from charges of conflict of interest in those exceptional cases where individual tutoring is allowed, the following guidelines are provided:

1. A teacher may not accept any kind of remuneration for tutoring any student enrolled in his/her class.
2. No tutoring for which a teacher receives a fee will be carried on in a school building.
3. Teachers who accept outside tutoring engagements make their own arrangements with the parents/guardians for the fees to be assessed.
4. A teacher should not accept tutoring employment in subject/grade levels in which the teacher is not certificated.
