PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES

It is expected that psychoeducational services, as required by federal and state law and as indicated by the Riverside County SELPA, shall be provided by personnel employed by or authorized by the District. In performing their duties, school psychologists employed by the District shall adhere to the following requirements:

- 1. Job description requirements for school psychologists
- 2. District policies and regulations
- 3. An accepted professional code of ethics
- 4. School psychologists who possess a license to practice privately may not accept a fee or other form of remuneration for professional work with a student who is entitled to such service through the district.
- 5. School psychologists who possess a license to practice privately may not accept a fee or other form of remuneration for professional work with a student who is enrolled in the same school to which the psychologist is assigned.
