### RELEASE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION

#### Definition

Directory information means information contained in a student record that would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. Such student information includes: (Education Code 49061; 20 USC 1232g; 34 CFR 99.3)

- 1. Name
- Address
- 3. Telephone number
- 4. Email address
- Date of birth
- 6. Major field of study
- 7. Participation record in officially recognized activities and sports
- 8. Weight and height of athletic team members
- 9. Dates of attendance
- 10. Degrees and awards received
- 11. Most recent previous school attended

(cf. 1114 - District-Sponsored Social Media)
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Directory information does not include a student's social security number or student identification number. However, for purposes of accessing or communicating in electronic systems, directory information may include a student identification number, user identification, or other personal identifier used by the student provided that the identifier cannot be used to gain access to education records except when used in conjunction with a personal identification number, password, or other factor known or possessed only by the authorized user. (34 CFR 99.3)

Directory information also does not include a student's citizenship status, immigration status, place of birth, or any other information indicating national origin.

# RELEASE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION (continued)

#### **Notification to Parents/Guardians**

At the beginning of each school year, all parents/guardians shall be notified as to the categories of directory information the district plans to release and the recipients of the information. The notification shall also inform parents/guardians of their right to refuse to let the district designate any or all types of information as directory information, how to refuse release, and the period of time within which a parent/guardian must notify the district in writing that he/she does not want a certain category of information designated as directory information. (Education Code 49063, 49073; 20 USC 1232g; 34 CFR 99.37)

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In addition, the annual parental notification shall include a statement that directory information does not include citizenship status, immigration status, place of birth, or any other information indicating national origin and that the district will not release such information without parental consent or a court order.

The Local Education Agency (LEA) shall avoid the disclosure of information that might indicate a student's or family's citizenship or immigration status if the disclosure is not authorized by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). LEA personnel shall take the following action steps upon receiving an information request related to a student's or family's immigration or citizenship status:

- 1. Notify a designated LEA official about the information request.
- 2. Provide students and families with appropriate notice and a description of the immigration officer's request.
- 3. Document any verbal or written request for information by immigration authorities.
- 4. Unless prohibited, provide students and parents/guardians with any documents issued by the immigration-enforcement officer.

(cf. 5145.13 – Response to Immigration Enforcement)

The Superintendent or designee shall notify parents/guardians that they may request that the district not release the name, address, and telephone number of their child to military recruiters, employers, or institutions of higher education without prior written consent. (20 USC 7908)

### **RELEASE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION** (continued)

Except for investigations of child abuse, child neglect, or child dependency, or when the subpoena served on the local education agency prohibits disclosure, the LEA shall provide parental or guardian notification of any court orders, warrants, or subpoenas before responding to such requests.

#### Parent/Guardian Consent

No directory information of a student identified as a homeless child or youth as defined in 42 USC 11434a shall be released, unless the parent/guardian, or the student if he/she is 18 years or older, has provided written consent that directory information may be released. For any other student, directory information shall not be released if his/her parent/guardian notifies the district in writing that such information not be disclosed without the parent/guardian's prior consent. (Education Code 49073; 20 USC 1232g, 7908)

The LEA shall require written parental or guardian consent for release of student information, unless the information is relevant for a legitimate educational interest or includes directory information only. Neither exception permits disclosing information to immigration authorities for immigration-enforcement purposes; no student information shall be disclosed to immigration authorities for immigration-enforcement purposes without a court order or judicial subpoena.

The LEA's request for written or parental or guardian consent for release of student information must include the following information:

- 1. The signature and date of the parent, guardian, or eligible student providing consent:
- 2. A description of the records to be disclosed;
- 3. The reason for release of information;
- 4. The parties or class of parties receiving the information; and
- 5. If requested by the parents, guardians or eligible student, a copy of the records to be released.

The LEA shall permanently keep the consent notice with the record file.

# RELEASE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION (continued)

The parent, guardian, or eligible student is not required to sign the consent form. If the parent, guardian or eligible student refuses to provide written consent for the release of student information that is not otherwise subject to release, the LEA shall not release the information.

For a former student, the district shall continue to honor any valid request to opt out of the disclosure of directory information made while the student was in attendance at the district, unless the opt-out request has been rescinded. (34 CFR 99.37)
