Often students, and even adults, struggle with making mistakes, especially in math. That fear of being wrong will lead to a fixed mindset and belief that one is not good at something, or not smart, which greatly hinders learning. Someone with a fixed mindset will shy away from challenges. Studies show that we learn from mistakes and when one has a Growth Mindset, instead of a fixed mindset, real learning can happen. We believe everyone can learn and everyone can, in time, master math, science, reading and writing concepts and skills.

At Curran we help students develop a Growth Mindset. Students with a Growth Mindset believe abilities can be developed through hard work and perseverance. The key to creating a Growth Mindsets, where mistakes lead to real learning, is by having a community where everyone is respectful, responsible, safe, and kind.

Curran has an incredible, energetic staff that is dedicated to the academic and social/emotional growth of all students. There have been several staff changes for this new school year and I ask for your support and patience as we become part of the school community.

For all students to have the best chance for success, parent/guardian engagement is a must. Make sure to read the monthly newsletter as it is the primary way, we communicate upcoming events, keep you informed, and share opportunities to get involved. I also encourage you to reach out to your child's teacher about volunteering in the classroom.
