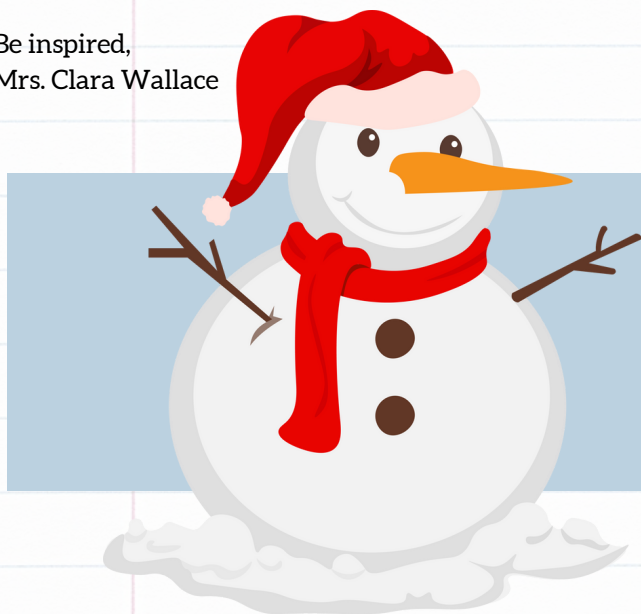

### PROCESS ART & CREATIVE IDEAS FOR YOUR KIDS

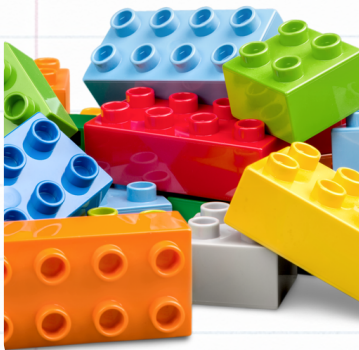
