
Mission Of WorkAbility I

What Is WorkAbility I?

The WorkAbility I (WAI) program provides comprehensive pre-employment skills training, employment placement and follow-up for students in special education who are making the transition from school to work, independent living, and post-secondary education or training.

The WAI program offers students with an Individualized Education Program (IEP) the opportunity to complete their secondary education while also obtaining marketable job skills.

WorkAbility I is administered and funded by the California Department of Education.

Student Qualifications

- Have an IEP
- Provide necessary documents (i.e. Social Security card, photo ID, etc.)
- Demonstrate positive citizenship and good attendance at school and job sites
- Cooperate with employers' and staff guidance and directives all classes

Student Benefits

The WAI program offers students with an Individualized Education Program (IEP) the opportunity to complete their secondary education while also obtaining marketable job skills. WAI provides secondary students with an understanding of job-seeking and job-keeping skills. The employability of students improves through occupational class training and on-the-job subsidized or unsubsidized work experience.
