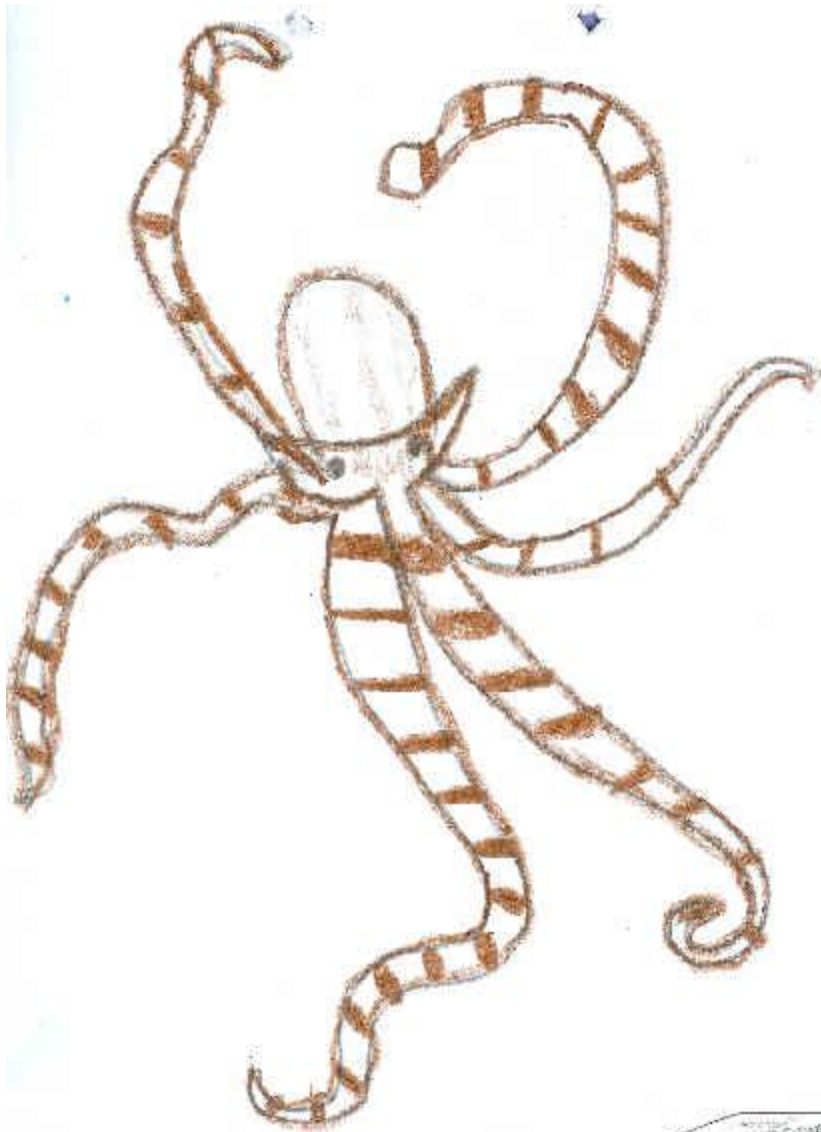


# Indo Malayan Mimic Octopus
