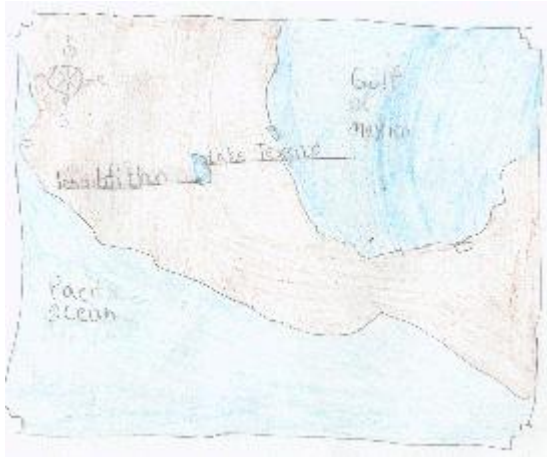


The Aztec Tribe

Introduction: The Aztec Indians lived in central Mexico from the 14th to the 16th century. Their capital was Tenochtitlan, an island in Lake Texcoco. The Aztecs believed in many different gods.

Clothing: Aztec women wore wrap-around skirts decorated with bright shiny feathers from tropical birds. The men wore loincloths with ponchos over them. The rulers wore cotton cloth, and the peasants had to weave maguey fiber cloth. They were not allowed to wear nice things.



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Food: Most Aztec people ate maize. It was ground into flour to make tortillas or porridge. Most meals had made a vegetable like tomatoes, avocados, and papayas.
