The Hopi women built their houses. They made them out of mud and clay. The clay kept the home warm in the winter and cool in the summer. The house had two stories, the upper for living, and bottom for storage.

The Hopi people wore shell and turquoise jewelry. The men wore shirts and kilts made from animal skins and woven cloth. The women wore a dress called a mantra with the right shoulder covered and the left shoulder bare. Their shoes are called moccasins which are made of leather, plant leaves, or rabbit fur.





Food

The Hopi Indian men hunted for wild turkey, deer, rabbit, bear, quail, sheep, duck, and dove. They used a planting stick to make holes in the soil. Then they put corn seeds in the holes and watered with melted snow. The women planted gardens in terraces at the mesas.
