The Seminole lived in a chickee. The chickee was built with a cypress log frame and a palmetto thatch roof. The sides were open so the wind could blow through. There was hardly any furniture in the chickee. They slept in hammocks.

I thought these were interesting facts:

The Seminole were excellent wood carvers.

The women cooked for the entire village. Everyone ate in the eating house. There were two big meals during the day, breakfast and lunch. Everybody ate with their fingers.

Women wore many beads at a time so none of their neck showed.
