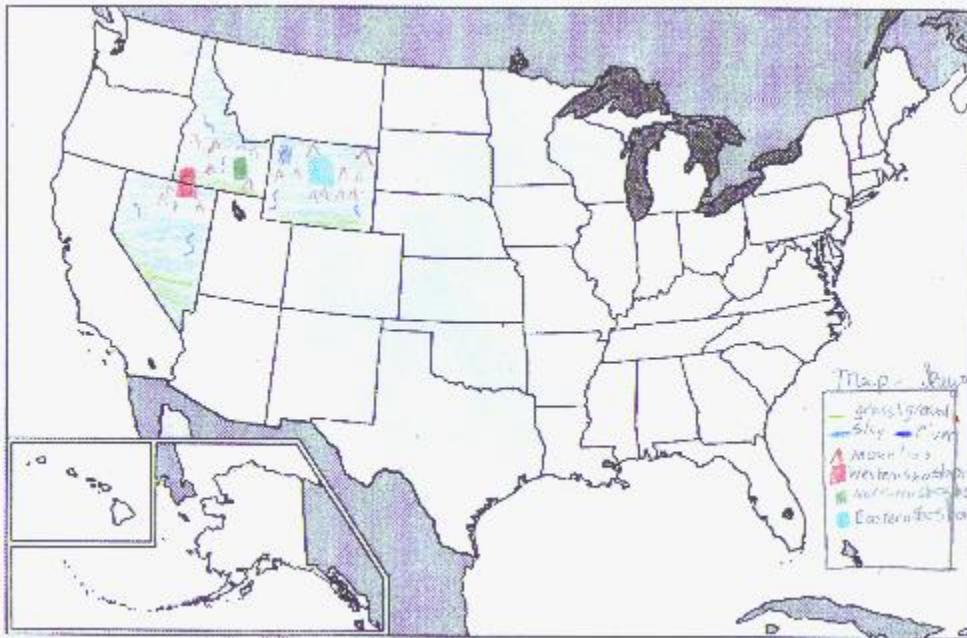

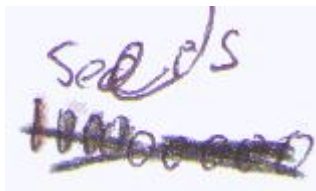
My Tribe Report

Shoshoni



Dwellings

The Shoshoni tribe lived in many kinds of dwellings. Some of the Shoshoni Indians used branches on animal hides to make their houses. Other bands dug their homes out of hillsides. But others lived in teepees. They made their homes out of poles and buffalo skins. One band of Indians lived in each kind of home. In smaller bands, there were only about ten people all related. The bigger bands were made of several families.



Food

Not any place had enough food to support a band. So they couldn't build permanent villages. While hunting for food, they moved along a great deal. The tribe got their food by hunting, fishing, and gathering plants. They hunted wild sheep, antelope, birds, buffalo, and squirrels. The tribe fishermen fished salmon and other fish. The Shoshoni also ate roots, seeds, berries, and grasshoppers. Shoshoni bands were known as what they ate.



Clothing

In the summer, the Shoshoni hardly wore any clothes. The men only wore loin cloths, and the women wore an apron. In the winter, the Shoshoni tribe made robes out of animal skins to wear.
