What did they eat? Corn, beans, squash, pineapple, tomatoes, wild rice and potatoes! What did they wear? The women wore knee length skirts and men wore breeth clothes with leggings they also wore headbands and the chief might wear a single feather in the headband.

What special ceremonies did they have? Thanksgiving, Harvest ceremony, and a signing ceremony!

What homes did they build? Small round houses called Wetus or Wigwams, 8 to 10 feet tall, wooden frames that are covered with woven mats and sheets of birch bark usually shaped like a dome!
