


COPING WITH STRONG FEELINGS

One of the activities that we will be doing as a school in "returning to normal" is testing! While this may not be a favorite exercise for students it is still a critical measure of progress. The focus of classroom counseling instruction will be learning and using coping skills to manage strong feelings. We are aware that anxiety levels are high for some and supporting students in managing feelings will help them be happier and healthier.

Besides preparation, nutrition and rest, typical coping strategies include deep centered breathing and counting when stressed. Classroom counseling lessons will emphasis the power of positive self-talk to not only process feelings but will discuss how to refocus them so students can be in the best mindset to do their best! For our younger students, we will focus on using these skills when upset either at a person or situation. 


SCENARIOS BASED ON EACH STUDENT'S UNIQUE CIRCUMSTANCES

ASYMPTOMATIC (NO SYMPTOMS)



VACCINATED

MAY CONTINUE TO ATTEND SCHOOL

AND

Participate in SEED, co-curriculars and extra-curricular activities

AS LONG AS

Student is symptom free meaning student is not exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms or any signs of illness.



UNVACCINATED

Modified Quarantine recommendations:

CONTINUE TO ATTEND SCHOOL

AS LONG AS

Student is symptom free meaning, they are not showing any signs of illness or of COVID-19

AND

Continues to wear a mask at school

AND

Tests for COVID on day 5 after exposure

AND

Abstains from co-curriculars and activities.

SYMPTOMATIC SHOWING SIGNS OF ILLNESS



VACCINATED & UNVACCINATED

STAY HOME

SELF-ISOLATE - 5 days

TAKE A COVID TEST

IF TEST IS NEGATIVE,
Student may return when symptoms have resolved

AND

Student **has not had** a fever for 24 hours without the use of fever relieving medication

IF TEST IS POSITIVE

Student stay home for 5 days

AND

Test again on Day 5 from the onset of symptoms

IF test is negative student may return to school on day 6.

Email notifications are sent to all students who have a positive COVID-19 case in their class.



STUDENT COVID-19 TESTING

PCR and Antigen Testing is available at each school site. Please visit your school website or newsletter for testing schedule and instructions on how to register.

The State is providing at-home antigen test for each MVUSD student. If you have not picked up your students tests, please contact your students school.
