Toys/Electronics at School

How to Identify Bullying

When trying to identify bullying we look for 4 specific things.

- On purpose (the act is meant to cause harm either physically or emotionally)
- Repeated (we all have bad days and don't always make the best decisions but bullying happens
 continually over an extended amount of time not just once in awhile)
- One-Sided (The victim of bullying does nothing in return. The bully is the only one partaking in hurtful behaviors)
- Unfair (This pertains to an imbalance of <u>power</u> based on age, physical strength, size of group, etc. A
 student not getting their way or what they want from peers is <u>not bullying).</u>

What is the California Healthy Youth Act (CHYA)? A State law enacted on January 1, 2016 requiring all public schools, including charters to provide students with integrated, medically accurate, comprehensive sexual health and HIV prevention.

What grades are taught comprehensive Sex Ed in Murrieta Valley USD?

What topics are discussed in comprehensive Sex Ed?

- Puberty and Stages of Development

All lessons encourage students to talk to their parents about each topic

Are parents/guardians notified in advance?



Per State law, a letter notification is sent to all parents/guardians at least two weeks to a month in advance of the lessons.

Can parents/guardians opt their child out of (AB 939) Comprehesive Sex Ed?



The law makes it clear that parents can opt their children out of the California Healthy Youth Act, **comprehensive sex education** lessons by providing the school district with written notification.
