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Antelope Hills Drop Off and Pick Up

Morning Drop Off

The Bus Loop (north lot) is intended for buses and students with disabilities drop off and pick up. Vehicles that enter this loop <u>must have</u> the appropriate parking pass. Foot traffic for students and parents through this gate is permissible until 8:25 a.m. then the gates are closed. PLEASE DO NOT SIT IN THE LOOP AND WATCH YOUR CHILD WALK THROUGH THE GATES AS THIS SLOWS UP THE FLOW OF THE PARKING LOOP. We ask that you please do not use the daycare room as a way of going around the gate as it is extremely disruptive to that classroom. If you are arriving after 8:25 please use the main loop for drop off. School starts promptly at 8:30 a.m. for grades 1 -5, and at 8:15 a.m. for AM Kgn and SDC. Students who arrive after their start time will be marked as tardy.

Afternoon Pick Up

Please obey all traffic laws (no double parking, jaywalking, speeding, etc.) when picking up your children. PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THE TRAFFIC LOOP, EVER, as it slows down the entire lane of traffic. The main parking lot will continue to be chained off between 2:35 and 2:40 everyday. If your student is not being picked up please remind them to go straight to their final destination. No playing on the playground after school, walking to another location unknown to you, etc. This has prevented many of our student safety issues. Most importantly though is your patience. We realize that pick up can be stressful, especially when you are picking up at multiple schools, but we would appreciate your continued support.

Too Sick For School?

This is a question that many parents face this time of the year. These are some guidelines to help you decide if your child should come to school or not. When in doubt please consult your child's Doctor or the School Nurse.

FEVER – If your child's temperature is 100 degrees or higher, keep them at home. While at home encourage your child to drink plenty of fluids. Your child is to be fever free for 24 hours (without fever reducing medicine) before returning to school.

MILD COUGH/RUNNY NOSE – If there is no fever and your child feels fairly good, school is fine. If the discharge is green, it may indicate a bacterial infection and the child may need to see their doctor.

BAD COUGH/COLD SYMPTOMS - Children with bad coughs need to stay home, and possibly see a doctor. It could be a severe cold or possibly bronchitis, flu, or pneumonia. But when the cough improves, and the child is feeling better, then it's back to school. Don't wait for the cough to disappear entirely -- that could take a week or sometimes even longer.

DIARRHEA/VOMITTING – If accompanied by fever or malaise - Keep your child home until the illness is over, and for 24 hours after the last episode (without medicine).

SORE THROAT- A minor sore throat is usually not a problem, but a severe sore throat could be strep throat even if there is no fever. Other symptoms of strep throat in children are headache and stomach upset. Keep your child home from school, and contact a doctor. Your child needs a special test to determine if it is strep throat. He or she can return to school 24 hours after antibiotic treatment begins.

EARACHE - Your child needs to see a doctor as ear pain almost always indicates infection.

PINK EYE (CONJUNCTIVITIS) - Keep the child home until a doctor has given the OK to return to school. Pink eye is highly contagious and may be bacterial and if so, will respond to an antibiotic.

RASH - Children with a skin rash should see a doctor especially if accompanied by a fever, as this could be one of several infectious diseases.



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Antelope Hills Dress Code Policy

Please remember dress code applies for ALL school events

The purpose of a school-wide DRESS CODE is to establish a school environment that supports a productive academic atmosphere, which supports students' learning and reflects the educational values of the staff and the parents. These standards are consistent with those established by California Education Code and the Murrieta Valley Unified School District. Please take the time to review these guidelines with your children.

The following items of clothing/accessories are considered inappropriate and/or disruptive to the educational process and are unacceptable for school attire:

- Spaghetti straps, strapless tops or tube tops
- Bare midriffs no belly button and/or skin showing
- Short shorts or Short skirts,
- Undergarments showing (i.e., bra straps showing, baggy pants worn below the waist)
- Emblems, lettering, or pictures related to drugs, alcohol, sex, or profanity
- Thong-type sandals, flip flops, roller skate type shoes
- Any items of clothing or manner of wearing clothing which contributes to the disruption of a productive learning environment and the safe operation of the school
- Hats inside the building or classroom
- Do rags, and bandanas are not allowed

Hats, caps, beanies, or visors may be appropriate on the playground during recess to protect students from the sun. Students should be reminded that wearing these items is a privilege which may be lost if they become a distraction in the classroom or a problem on the playground.

Please know how very much your support and cooperation with our school dress code policy is valued. The positive message that school is a place to work and learn is reinforced when our students come to school dressed appropriately. Thank you for reviewing these guidelines with your child and helping us to reinforce appropriate school attire.
