COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The goals of this course are to provide students with information, resources, and strategies to help them become introduced to reading, writing, listening, and speaking French, while encouraging students to experience different cultures and perspectives and to prepare students for French level two

COURSE CONTENT OBJECTIVES:

Curriculum is designed to teach students cultural aspects relevant to the French speaking culture while improving grammar and speaking skills. Over the course of the year we will use the présent, futur proche and passé composé tenses, adjectives and object pronouns. Concepts studied include but are not limited to introductions, school and leisure activities, food, and daily habits.
