B-1: Discussion regarding Common Core State Standards

Mr. Kenn Young, Riverside County Superintendent of Schools provided an overview of the history of California state standards, testing and accountability. He discussed 21st century workforce expectations and the importance of reading, writing and arithmetic which are foundational gateway subjects to college and career readiness. He shared dismal student statistics which highlight the misalignment between K-12 preparation, and postsecondary and workforce expectations; and reported that 50% of freshman students entering the CSU and UC system need remediation in English Language Arts (ELA) and/or Mathematics. Moreover, despite California's current rigorous ELA and Math standards, they include far more information than students will ever use, much that is irrelevant and much that is taught in a way they cannot relate to. Mr. Young reported that Common Core standards were designed to address these rigor, relevance and relation problems.

B-1: Discussion regarding Common Core State Standards (Continued) Following Mr. Young's report, the Board asked questions and provided comments to Mr. Young and administrative staff regarding the implementation of the new Common Core standards.

In closing, Superintendent Kelley said that the ultimate goal is to instruct students in a more effective way and stressed the need to support teachers along the way; both will be critical to our success in the next ten years and beyond.
