Trick or Treat Safety

Kids look forward to Holloween for many reasons. They like dressing up in costumes, but the mostly, they like it for the candy and treats! Who wouldn't? Give your kids some precious Holloween memories that they'll have for life.

Here's some tips to help your children be safe on Holloween night:

- Children should always go out trick or treating accompanied by a responsible adult.
- Be careful when crossing the street. Make sure to look in both directions and make sure that there are no cars coming.
- Instruct your children not to eat any treats until they bring them home to be examined by you.
- Instruct your children to never go into the home of a stranger or get into their car.
- Make sure your child carries a flashlight, glow stick or has reflective tape on their costume to make them more visible to cars.
- For older children-let them know that they should stay together as a group if going out to Trick or Treat without an adult.
- Plan a safe route so parents know where their older children will be at all times. Set a time for their return home.
