

# Navigating Appropriate Media Usage for Kids



In today's digital age, children have access to an abundance of media, from video games and movies to social media platforms and streaming services. While media can be a valuable educational and entertainment tool, it is important for parents to guide their children toward appropriate content that aligns with their developmental stage. #### **Set Age-Appropriate Boundaries**

Not all media is suitable for all age groups. Parents should check ratings and content descriptions before allowing their children to engage with games, movies, shows, or social media. A great resource for this is <a href="Common Sense Media">Common Sense Media</a>, where parents can search for books, games, movies, and shows to determine their appropriateness for specific age groups.



#### **Encourage Balanced Media Consumption**

Encourage a healthy balance by setting screen time limits, promoting outdoor play, reading, and family activities. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends consistent limits on media use and prioritizing activities such as sleep, schoolwork, and social interactions.

Social media platforms can expose children to various risks, including cyberbullying, inappropriate content, and privacy concerns. Parents should:

- Set privacy settings to the highest level.
- Educate children on safe online behavior.
