Leadership Education Program

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The MCJROTC Leadership Education Program is designed to develop in young people those traits most sought after by colleges, universities, and employers. It is NOT a recruiting program for the military. In fact, the majority of students who complete the four-year curriculum go on to pursue careers in professions other than the military. Many cadets go on to have very successful college and professional careers.

There are unique benefits to participating in the program. These include development of:

- facilitation with earning an ROTC scholarship

The program of instruction is designed to progress from basic character and leadership development to the development of skills that can be listed on your first résumé . Our cadets are sought after by universities and employers because they know that our graduates are able to successfully contend with stress and adversity and are able to manage tasks in a productive manner.

PROGRAM OF INSTRUCTION

The POI is based on character and leadership training conducted by the United States Marine Corps. Below is a short synopsis of what our cadets learn.

Leadership Education I

- Designed for the new cadet, this POI introduces the student to basic principles of character and leadership. Students are challenged mentally and physically in order to develop self-discipline, self-confidence, and judgment. This is the most important stage of training.

Leadership Education II

- Second-year students further their development through the assignment of leadership positions within the unit. Cadets can expect to hold positions of authority, responsibility and accountability.

Leadership Education III

- Third-year students begin to develop management skills while continuing their character and leadership development. They can expect to be assigned a leadership position within the unit.

Leadership Education IV

- These cadets are assigned senior leadership positions within the unit and are expected to assist in the development of underclassmen. They exercise leadership via real-life tasks.
