May is Asian Pacific American Heritage Month—a time to recognize and honor the histories, cultures, and contributions of individuals and families from Asia and the Pacific Islands, including Hawaii, Samoa, the Philippines, China, Japan, Korea, Vietnam, and many others.

This month was originally chosen to commemorate the arrival of the first Japanese immigrants to the United States in May 1843, as well as the completion of the transcontinental railroad in May 1869, which was made possible in large part by Chinese immigrant labor.

Families can learn more about this important month and explore the diverse stories of Asian Pacific Americans by using the virtual library links.

MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day is a solemn day of remembrance, honoring all the men and women who have died in service to the United States armed forces. The holiday traces its roots back to May 30, 1868, when it was first observed as Decoration Day, following the Civil War, as a time to pay tribute to fallen soldiers. In 1971, Memorial Day was officially declared a federal holiday, now observed annually on the last Monday in May. This year, Memorial Day will be observed on Monday, May 26, 2025.

The day is also recognized by many as Poppy Day, a tradition observed in several countries around the world. In the United States, The American Legion introduced National Poppy Day®, encouraging Americans to wear a red poppy on the Friday before Memorial Day. The red poppy serves as a powerful symbol—honoring those who gave their lives and showing support for veterans and active–duty service members.


