The Educational Services staff provided the Board with an update on the implementation of The Profile of a Graduate since its adoption last year. They reviewed survey data regarding the four competencies: Academically Ready, Civic Minded, Life Ready and Workplace Ready. The survey results will assist the staff teams from each high school in developing grade-level projects to support each of the competencies. The staff is projecting that the class of 2027 will be the inaugural class with new projects reflecting the Profile of a Graduate.

H. SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Superintendent Dr. Andrus reflected on the past week's challenges, which included a significant network disruption and communications regarding Board Policy 5020.1 Parental Notification. He expressed his gratitude for the Chief Technology Officer and his staff for their successful recovery of all network systems. Dr. Andrus also mentioned the start of the student award season, highlighting the importance of acknowledging the students' remarkable achievements. He encouraged the community to attend public events at schools to strengthen relationships and witness what really happens on a school district campus.

I. BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

Trustee Nicolas Pardue said the "Every 15 Minutes" program is an extraordinary experience that everyone should witness and participate in; it is extremely emotional. Mr. Pardue spoke about his recent trip to Washington D.C. for CSBA's Coast2Coast Advocacy trip. He questioned if CASP testing accurately measures a student's abilities in the subject areas or if the scores are poor due to a misalignment with the curriculum.

Trustee Nancy Young discussed her meeting with elected officials during CSBA's Coast2Coast Advocacy trip to work toward more resources and equitable special education funding for local school districts. Mrs. Young participated in various community and school events, including Murrieta Mesa's Orchestra performance for fourth grade students, unified track meet, Vista Murrieta's car show, AAPAC and LPAC meetings, school site visits, and drama performances. Additionally, she completed the third course in the Masters in Governance program.

Trustee Julie Vandegrift attended several Learn@Home classes alongside Principal Gabriela DiGiovani. She participated in a webinar training on School Board members' use of social media, the Crystal Apple awards ceremony, and the Student of the Month breakfast.

Trustee Linda Lunn highlighted the "Every 15 Minutes" program, which educates students on the grave consequences of driving while impaired. Mrs. Lunn discussed her interactions with elected officials discussing data and cybersecurity during the CSBA Coast2Coast advocacy trip to Washington D.C. and echoed Mrs. Young's comments regarding funding for special education services. Mrs. Lunn also spoke about connecting with the community and parents at the numerous school and district events she attends on a regular basis.


