



The Wallit App is a chore and banking system that connects children to the concept of money. Eliminate the nagging and activate self-sufficiency for your teens. Wallit helps automate everyday money needs like setting allowances, establishing savings goals, and tracking spending. Give your teens the tools they need to succeed and give yourself a break from the constant money requests.

How it works:

1. Add your bank accounts- Sign up and Wallit will integrate directly with your existing bank or credit union account.

2. Add your family- Add your family members, including teens! Everyone will be connected through Wallit.

3. Assign and Approve Tasks- From preset chores and tasks to self-created ones, assign a value and task to each child, when completed it adds that amount to their account or they can transfer their balance to a gift card of their choice. Here is a link to step by step with more explanation on how the app works.

Pros: This app really shows kids that they earn money with they work hard. It helps to build a sense of finance. We love to use it for our child who drives and wants gas money or wants to go out with friends because they have learned the fun comes at a cost and requires work. They are also able to set goals for see how long it takes to achieve that goal. Each child is required to set a goal of something they always want to buy and have always have a goal. If they achieve one goal, they have to set another. One child my want to buy their letterman's jacket that costs over \$500 while the other may want an Apple watch at \$250. They can choose to put all or just some of their money they earn towards that goal. We also require them to save 10% of what they have monthly into a savings account.

Cons: It does require multiple checking accounts. We had to open a checking account for each child. Banks have really worked with children to allow these kinds of accounts. Also, it does require linking of you own personal account. When I opened the accounts for our children, I also opened another one just linked to those accounts for that purpose. That also meant that I limited myself and the children on how much monthly they can earn. Overall as a family we have seen the work ethic and financial understanding of our children increase using the app and system. This app goes on my must haves for parents of teens and pre-teens.


What We Wish You Knew


