Course Title: Marching for Fitness

Course Number: 2760

Grade Level: 10-12

Length of Course: Semester (Fall)

Prerequisite: Successful completion of PE 9

Course Description: This course must be taken for 2 fall semesters to obtain a second year of Physical Education credit. A student enrolling in this class is required to provide documentation to his/her school counselor that his/her school plan in grades 10,11, and 12 is completely filled with no options or openings to schedule a second year of Physical Education.

I. Goals

The student will:

- A. Improve cardiovascular-respiratory fitness
- B. Improve flexibility
- C. Improve muscular strength
- D. Improve self-image
- E. Determine target heart rate zone
- F. Recognize and practice a nutritionally sound diet
- G. Discuss and demonstrate variable resistance exercises
- H. Evaluate and chart fitness progress
- I. Understand the need for lifetime fitness
- J. Understand the importance of fitness responsibility, including setting goals and scheduling workouts
- K. Understand the discipline needed to follow through with lifetime fitness

II. Outline of Content for Major Areas of Study

Semester I and II

- A. Study body systems and their relationships to fitness training
- B. Define and apply the components of physical fitness:
 - Muscular Strength
 - Muscular Endurance
 - Flexibility
 - Cardiovascular-respiratory
 - Body composition analysis
- C. Apply techniques of breathing and marching properly
- D. Develop a nutrition and weight control program
- E. Develop specific fitness plans for personal activities
- F. Monitor, record and optimize resting and exercise heart rates within a target zone
- G. Using a pedometer, monitor and record in a daily log the total steps taken during marching for fitness class with a target step rate of 5000 steps per class meeting.

III. Accountability Determinants

- A. Teacher observations of techniques and workouts
- B. Individual performances, tests, research paper, and journal entries
- C. Final assessment
