Exam order time is around the corner! Please make sure to get started on the following steps!

Step 1: Register each AP course in your College Board account. Each class section has a unique which your teacher can provide for you. Please complete this step ASAP!

Step 2: Beginning September 12th, log in to <u>www.totalregistration.net/054357/ap</u> to pay for your exam(s). Priority payment ends on October 31st, 2022.

- Exam Costs: \$101.
- AP Research and AP Seminar: \$151
- Families may make payments if they wish. In order to reserve an exam, a \$40 down payment has to be made by October 31st, 2022. All exams need to be paid in full by March 8, 2023.
- Beginning November 1st at 12:01 AM, a \$10 late fee will be added to each exam.
- Total Registration will be shut down on November 15th to allow us to finalize the exam order.
- Beginning November 16th at 12:01 AM, Total Registration will re-open. At that point, each exam will have a \$40 late fee added to it.

Each exam cancelled after November 15th will have a \$45 cancellation fee.

WARNING SIGNS OF SUICIDE:

The behaviors listed below may be some of the signs that someone is thinking about suicide.

TALKING ABOUT:



- ▶ Wanting to die
- □ Great guilt or shame
- ▷ Being a burden to others

FEELING:



- Empty, hopeless, trapped, or having no reason to live
- Extremely sad, more anxious, agitated, or full of rage
- > Unbearable emotional or physical pain

CHANGING BEHAVIOR, SUCH AS:



- Making a plan or researching ways to die
 - Withdrawing from friends, saying good bye, giving away important items, or making a will
- Taking dangerous risks such as driving extremely fast
- Displaying extreme mood swings
- Eating or sleeping more or less
- Using drugs or alcohol more often

If these warning signs apply to you or someone you know, get help as soon as possible, particularly if the behavior is new or has increased recently.

- Single or double spaced, 12pt. Times New Roman preferred unless the poem's form dictates the format (example: blackout poetry, erasures, visual poetry, etc.).
